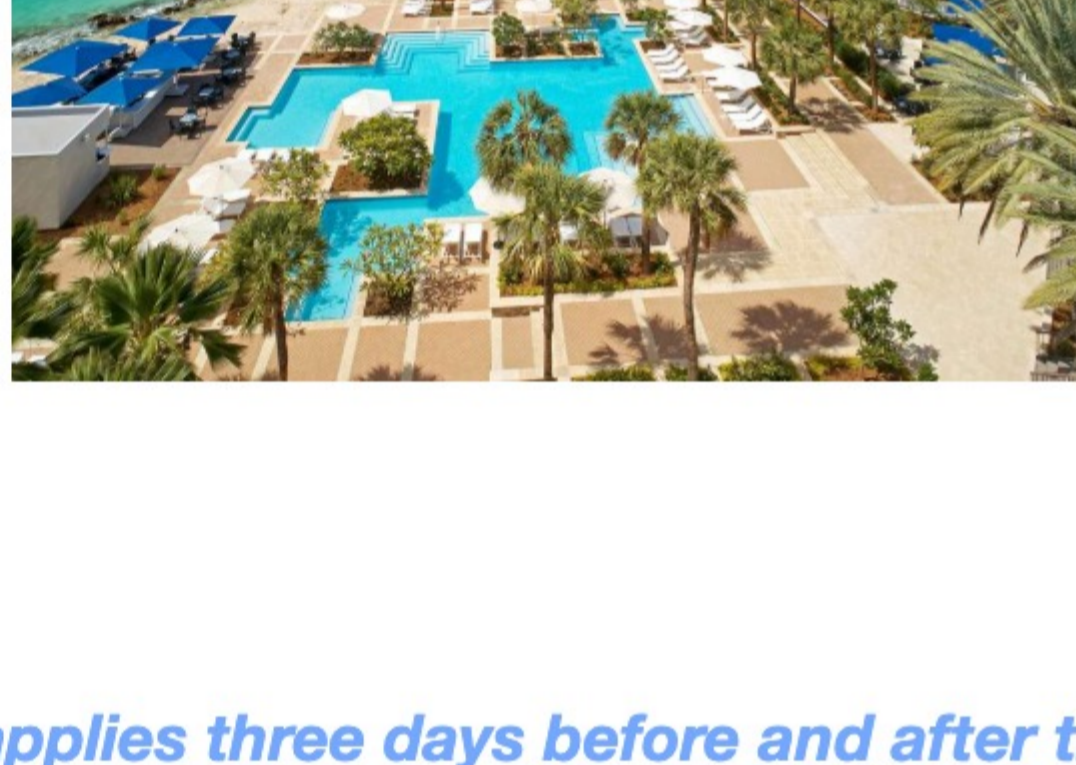
Networking and celebration

Getting around Curaçao

Options to explore the island



Getting to and around Curaçao is easy, but it's best to plan ahead. Here are the top transport options:

Taxis: Upon exiting the airport, you'll find a stand for official taxis. They're a safe and reliable option to reach your hotel. Fares are usually fixed and regulated. We recommend confirming the cost with the driver before starting your journey.

Car rentals: If you'd like to explore the island at your own pace, renting a car is the best option. It gives you the freedom to visit Curaçao's famous beaches, Willemstad's city centre, and other points of interest during your free time. Several international agencies operate at the airport and across the island.

Public transport: Public transport in Curaçao consists of large buses known as "Konvooi," which serve the main routes at a very affordable cost. While this is a budget-friendly option, the bus routes and schedules may not be suitable for those with a tight itinerary. However, if you have an adventurous spirit, they can be a great way to explore.

If you are staying outside the venue, we recommend not relying on public transportation for your arrival due to potential timing issues.

Smaller buses (vans) are also part of the public transit, which can reach all corners of the island, all the way to your doorstep. The fare is a tiny bit more than the Konvooi, yet very affordable.

Transport Apps: While Uber and Lyft don't operate in Curaçao, there are local apps that work similarly. You can download Click Curaçao or 24-7 Taxi Curaçao to request rides easily with pre-set fares from your mobile.

Keep in mind that your participation fee includes airport-venue hotel-airport transportation for arrivals on October 29 and 30 and for departures on November 2 and 3.
