The 29th Interamerican Scout Conference is getting closer! Excitement is building across the region, and we're already looking forward to welcoming you to the beautiful island of Curaçao for an unforgettable experience.

To ensure your only concern is enjoying and learning, we've prepared this bulletin with essential information you need to take care of before travelling. Please read each point carefully.

## Essential requirements for your trip

Securing your entry to Curaçao is very simple if you follow these two mandatory steps:

### Step 1



#### Yellow fever vaccination

Travellers arriving from countries considered at risk of yellow fever transmission must present a valid vaccination certificate.

#### When to get vaccinated?

You must receive the vaccine **at least 10 days before your travel date.**

#### What document to bring?

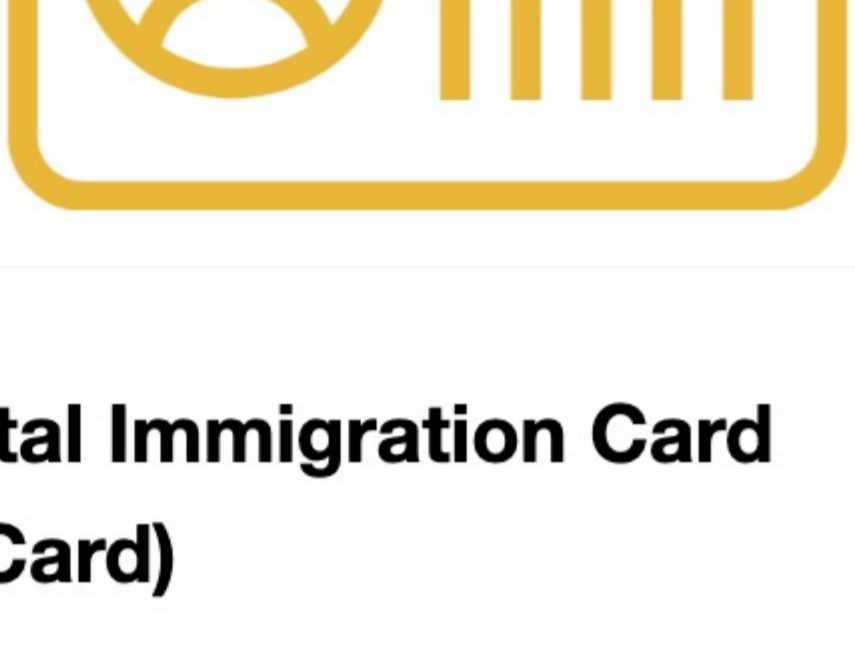
It is essential to carry your International Certificate of Vaccination, also known as the yellow card.

#### Exemptions:

If you are unable to get vaccinated for medical reasons, you must present an official exemption document.

We recommend checking the [official WHO list of countries with risk of yellow fever transmission and countries that require yellow fever vaccination](#), and booking your vaccination appointment as soon as possible.

### Step 2



#### Digital Immigration Card (DI Card)

This is a mandatory online form for all visitors arriving in Curaçao.

#### How to get it?

You can only complete it on the official website: <https://dicardcuracao.com>. The process is quick and can be done from home.

#### What do you receive?

Once completed, you'll receive a PDF document via email.

#### When do you use it?

You must present this document, either printed or on your phone, to the airline before boarding and to the authorities upon arrival on the island.

**Important:** Upon arrival in Curaçao, state that the purpose of your visit is to attend the Conference. Do not say "business", as this may require a different type of visa.

## Safe from Harm a commitment for everyone



We want the Conference to be a safe and positive experience for everyone. As part of our commitment to wellbeing, **all participants are required to complete the Safe from Harm learning pathway**, made up of three modules specially designed for our event.

Remember, **you must present your valid certificate** as part of your event registration. If you haven't done so yet, you can complete the modules by [clicking here](#). It won't take more than 45 minutes, and you can do it at your own pace.

In addition, during the event we will have a **Listening Ears** station—a safe and quiet space with a team of volunteers ready to listen and support anyone who needs it—as well as a form to report any incidents.

## Get ready for the Nighth of the Americas

One of the most anticipated moments to celebrate our cultural diversity is the **Nighth of the Americas**. It will be an excellent opportunity to share the traditions, music and joy that characterise our region. We encourage all countries to **wear their traditional attire** to make this a memorable evening of cultural exchange.

#### Artistic Performances

If you wish to present a dance, song or other cultural expression, you must register in advance using [this form](#) by **17 October at 23:59 Panama time**.

This will allow us to organise the programme properly and ensure everyone has a chance to shine.

**Important:** Audio playback will only be allowed through the event's sound system. A small stage will be available.

#### Country Spaces

- Snacks, sweets or candies representative of your country. Food must be sealed in its original packaging, suitable for entry into the country through Customs.
- Tasting of national beverages will be allowed, served in small cups (shots), and must not be for sale.
- **Traditional decorations:** flags, bunting, tablecloths, balloons or other cultural items

#### Note that:

- Each NSO is responsible for checking which products may not be brought into the country (especially food). Please consult official sources for regulations.
- Please bring your own materials to set up your space. Nothing may be stuck or hung on the walls.

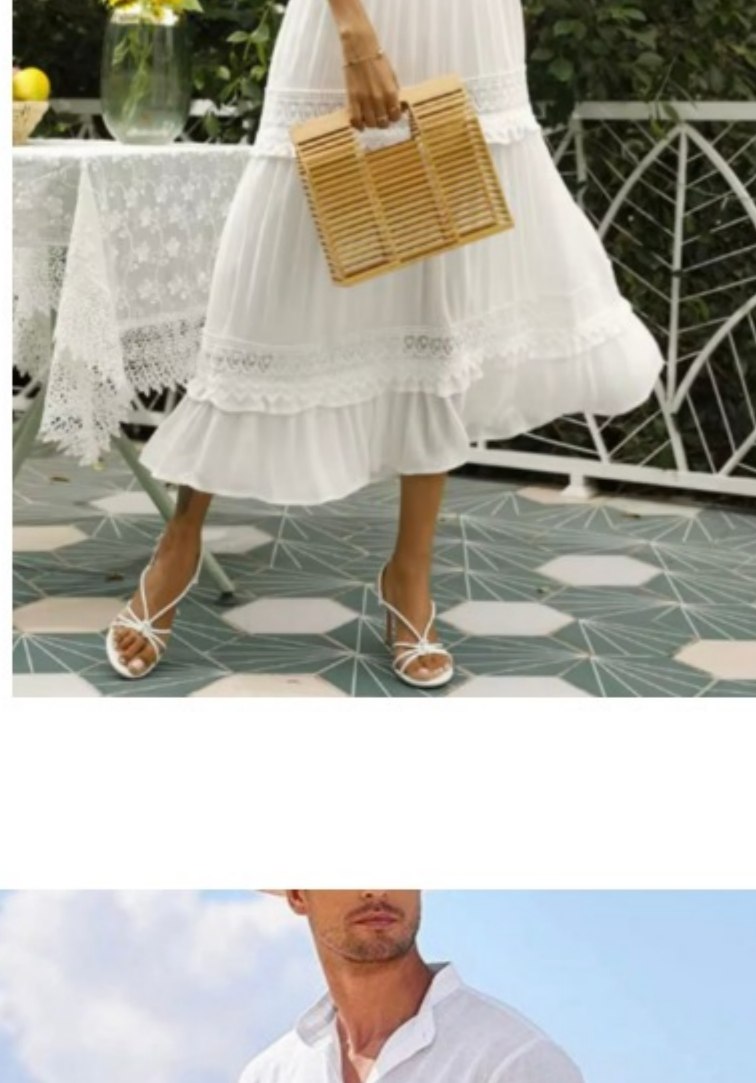
